Things Students and Parents Need to Know

SAFETY

- ➔ All students must pass a swim test to be held at the beginning of each session.
- ➔ Life jackets must be worn and fastened at all times out on the water and on the docks.
- ➔ All instructors are certified by U.S. Sailing and the U.S. Coast Guard and have completed basic first aid and CPR training.
- ➔ All on-the-water activity will be postponed in the event of any sudden or unexpected weather changes, high winds, lightning, etc.
- ➔ We encourage use of protection from the sun: clothing, hat and sun block.

WHAT TO BRING

- ➔ Coast Guard approved Type III life jacket (vest style).
- ➔ Sneakers or closed toe boat shoes. No flip-flops or open-toed sandals allowed.
- ➔ Adequate and appropriate clothing, including a change of clothes, jacket, hat, sunglasses, sun block, and towel.
- ➔ Snack and water bottle (no glass containers). (Snacks may be eaten out on the water or on land.)

- ➔ Please label all personal items with your child's name and leave valuables at home.

WEATHER

- ➔ Classes will be held in inclement weather.
- ➔ On-the-water instructions may take place in the rain so dress appropriately.
- ➔ In case of severe weather, land-based instruction will take place.

CLUB HOUSE

- ➔ Please make sure your child arrives on time and is picked up promptly at the end of the class session.
- ➔ When students arrive they are to wait for the beginning of class on the clubhouse porch or on the grass near the boat racks.
- ➔ Students may not pass through the gate to the dock ramp without being accompanied by an instructor.
- ➔ Bags can be stored inside the clubhouse on top of the sailing school table when class is in session.
- ➔ Youth students should be accompanied by an instructor while in the clubhouse.

The Kittery Point Yacht Club Sailing School has been teaching students the art and science of sailing for over 30 years. No matter what your experience level, you will leave the school with a better understanding of sailing. We are looking forward to an exciting and fun-filled summer!

The curriculum reinforces all basic skills taught in Beginner and progresses to more technical sailing skills and improved boat handling. Sailors will learn how to crew and skipper a double-handed dinghy. They will hone their seamanship skills to perfection.

→ RACING

Designed to refine the skills developed in either the Young Racer or Seamanship Courses. Fundamental and advanced racing skills and strategies will be taught and practiced, including Team Racing rules and tactics. Students must have completed the Seamanship Course or show proficiency in the Young Racer Program.



YOUTH PROGRAM

BEGINNER AND YOUNG RACER

Monday through Friday for 2 weeks, 9:00am - 12:00pm

→ BEGINNER

Designed for sailors ages eight and older who are ready to learn and practice fundamental sailing skills while gaining greater confidence skippering Turnabouts and Optimists. Sailors generally spend two to three years mastering the fundamentals in the Beginner Program before advancing to the Seamanship Level. Students are taught in the sailing school boats with one to three students per boat depending on skill level. The goal is to teach each sailor how to confidently control the tiller and sail simultaneously in order to handle the boats independently.

The curriculum includes nomenclature and knot tying, fundamentals of boat rigging and boat handling, wind direction, water safety and boat maintenance. More advanced students will gain confidence to skipper their boats in a range of wind conditions.

→ YOUNG RACER

A course structured to provide a framework for racing practice. It is aimed toward young people who have already completed our Beginner course and are competent sailors. We will concentrate on one-design racing using our new Optimists and occasionally our Turnabouts. While focusing on racing we will inject a good deal of fun and friendly competition in the mix. Our Young Racers will be invited and encouraged to attend local area events.

SEAMANSHIP AND RACING

Monday through Friday for 2 weeks, 1:00pm - 4:00pm

→ SEAMANSHIP

Designed for the more experienced sailor who demonstrates ability and confidence in skippering solo in Turnabouts and Optimists through all points of sail. When fully capable, students will transition to Laser Radials or Club 420 sailboats.

The curriculum includes boat preparation and tuning, on the water pre-start preparation, starting sequences and strategies, advanced boat handling skills, use of spinnakers and trapezes, upwind and downwind tactics, understanding wind shifts, and effects of current. Students will have an opportunity to race outside KPYC in both local Team Racing events and other outside regattas.

ADULT PROGRAM

Mondays and Wednesdays for 2 week, 5:30pm - 8:30pm

Catered toward the adult beginning sailor, although intermediate sailors are welcome. This course will develop fundamental sailing skills while giving students the confidence to skipper a sailboat alone. Students who progress quickly will have the opportunity to sail Lasers and Club 420s. Students will learn knot tying, basic boat handling, tacking, jibing, the points of sail, rules of the road and how to rig a sailboat. In the past some adults have taken multiple classes to hone their skills.
